




GRENADA citizenship by investment program

# CITIZENSHIP BY INVESTMENT PROGRAM

Under the guidelines of the Grenada Citizenship by Investment Act, the Grenada Citizenship by Investment Program was established in 2013. With the help of Grenada's pilot program, eligible investors and their families may apply for citizenship and take advantage of visa-free travel.

# Donation to the National Transformation Fund

Applicants must contribute at least US\$150,000 to Grenada's National Transformation Fund. The minimal amount only applies to the primary applicant. The criterion is set at US\$200,000 for a household of up to four persons. Each new dependant requires an additional gift of US\$25,000.

It should be noted that if an application contains an eligible parent under the age of fifty-five, an extra payment of USD 50,000 must be given in addition to the post-approval contribution. When an application contains an eligible sibling, an extra USD 75,000 commitment must be given in addition to the post-approval contribution.

## Certificates of Permanent Residency

Permanent residency has been completely eliminated from the citizenship by investment procedure. As As a result, the government no longer issues PR cards or certificates. Updates on an alternate form of national identification will be shared as they become available.

### **REAL ESTATE**

With its economy moving from agrarian to service-dominant, an investment in a pre-approved real estate project is one of the most viable possibilities for foreign nationals.

Applicants must invest a minimum of US\$350,000 and keep it for a minimum of four years. The primary applicant, the main applicant's spouse, and two qualified dependents are all included in the minimal amount. Each new dependant requires an additional US\$25,000 payment. It should be noted that if an application contains an eligible parent under the age of fifty-five, an extra payment of USD 50,000 must be given in addition to the post-approval contribution. If an application includes a qualifying sibling, an extra donation of USD 75,000 is required with the application donation after approval.

# GRENADA CITIZENSHIP ADVANTAGES

- -inclusion of dependent kids under 30 or kids with disabilities who live with and are supported totally by the primary applicant.
- -inclusion of younger, dependent siblings of the primary applicant or spouse who are not parents.
- -includes parents who are in need.
- -Visa-free travel is available to approximately 145 nations, including the Schengen region of Europe. Grenada and the U.S. signed the E-2 Visa Program, which permits nationals of Grenada to live and conduct a sizable company in the U.S.
- -There is no worldwide income tax.

## QUALIFICATIONS

Under the guidelines of the Grenada Citizenship by Investment Act, the Grenada Citizenship by Investment Program was established in 2013. With the help of Grenada's pilot program, eligible investors and their families may apply for citizenship and take advantage of visa-free travel.

The government of Grenada is collaborating closely with a small number of companies involved in manufacturing, agriculture, and tourism as part of its goal to draw in foreign direct investment. The government intends to execute the initiative in order to provide investment possibilities that will result in long-term employment.

## WHEN IS THE GRENADA CITIZENSHIP INVESTMENT REQUIRED TO BE PAID?

The investment is made in two parts after the processing and due diligence expenses have been paid. When submitting the citizenship application, an initial deposit must be made, and the remainder must be paid once granted. Following that, the passports are issued.

### DO I HAVE TO GIVE UP MY CURRENT CITIZENSHIP?

Grenada recognizes dual citizenship, thus investors can continue to use their present passports.

## HOW DOES THE E2 VISA TREATY BETWEEN GRENADA AND THE UNITED STATES WORK?

Grenada is the only Caribbean country that allows residents to apply for an E-2 Work Visa, which allows them to live and work in the United States. Processing time is typically two months or less, and the certificate is valid for up to five years with an unlimited number of renewals. In contrast to permanent residency in the United States, E-2 visa holders may be able to escape taxation on international income.
